Treasurer **Evert Van Bolhuis** gave his report. The bank balance stands at \$3,192, with \$298 in the Special Events account, leaving an operating balance of \$2,892. The very successful Christmas luncheon was subsidized \$190 by the club. **Ron Brannen** kindly donated a large magnet to sort out any iron-based coins from the collection baskets. This will probably not work because Canada has been altering its coinage of late. But the idea works with gold and silver, which are acceptable to Evert. We earned 32 cents in interest on our Bank Account this year, which is double that earned last year.

Bob Burns sent out the following cards: a *Thinking of You* to Clarence Marshall, Ron Browne and George Smith, and *Condolence*s to the families of John MacKenzie and Harry Miller.

Roy Millier is now accepting booking deposits for the trips to Orillia and Stratford. **George Smith** laid out plans for the upcoming trip to the House of Commons in Ottawa on April 28th. 

Due to the many different requirements and restrictions imposed by the various countries, all arrangements, including: visas, tickets, transportation, accommodation and guides, were handled by an London, U.K.- based adventure-travel company, that specializes in these trips.

Their travel companions included several others from the Brockville area, two of whom were at our meeting to give moral support and to relive their adventures.

The Trans-Siberian railway extends from Moscow to Vladivostock, with an extension terminating at Beijing, and in total, it crosses five time zones. They travelled second class, and each coach had it's own designated attendant and hot water system although there was a common dining coach. Accommodations varied, from hotels of different size and quality, to tents in the Mongolian desert, which is a very sparsely populated area of 3 million inhabitants.

When the train reached Vladivostock, the running gear was removed from each carriage and replaced with units having axles to suit the different gauge on the railway line leading to Beijing.

Language was not a problem, thanks to the guides chosen for them, and ATMs were readily available throughout their 9,000 km trip.

Doug Cook extended our thanks and presented them with a Probus pen and our certificate of appreciation.

If we rent a bus, that expense will be shared by those going. Sign up soon with **George Smith**.


